Dear Parents and Carers,

We would like to remind all parents that children must NOT use the school play/climbing equipment or the field before or after school. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

A reminder also to parents that once the children are dismissed from class, their health and safety on the school site becomes your responsibility and they should stay with you from that point on. On the subject of safety on the school site, we ask that all children and adults dismount all scooters and bikes once they enter the school gates.

Final reminder to all families, infant aged pupils do not need to bring in any snacks as they have school fruit during the mornings. If junior pupils wish to bring in a mid-morning snack it should be fruit, veg, cheese or a non-sugary cereal bar. Please continue to send a fresh bottle of water each day as we encourage children to drink as much as they can during the day to keep hydrated.

### Top Tips for meeting a new dog:

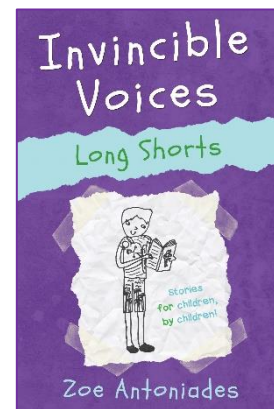
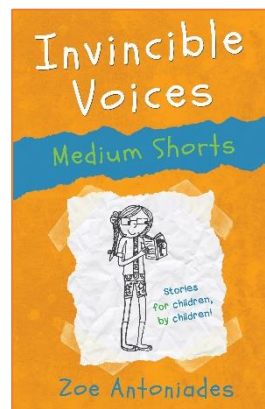
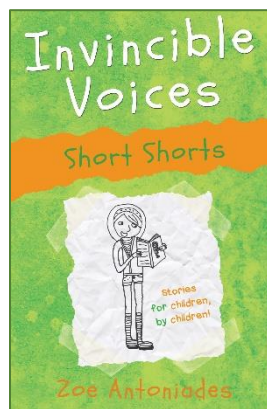
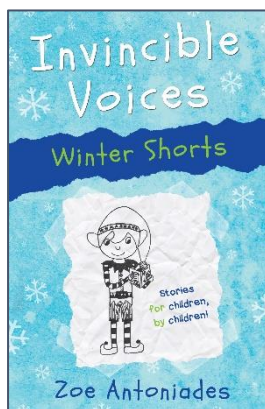
- Always ask permission before you stroke a dog
